Our move is still a few months away, so it's business as usual until then!


Your appointments, treatments, and services will not be affected by the move in the meantime. We'll be sure to update you with more details as the move gets closer.

### New COVID-19 booster targets new strains of the virus

#### What is RSV?

RSV (Respiratory syncytial virus) is a common respiratory virus that affects the nose, throat and lungs.

A new program for immunisation against RSV to protect newborn infants starts on February 3rd 2025. Pregnant women from 28-36 weeks gestation will be eligible for the Abrysvo vaccine to protect their unborn child. This will mesh with a program for newborns to be immunised in hospital if their mothers have not been immunised or if they have certain eligible conditions.
