A check can provide a clear picture of your heart health based on your medical history, lifestyle, and family history. Knowing your risk factors can empower you to make lifestyle changes, such as improving diet, increasing physical activity, or quitting smoking.

If you have conditions like high blood pressure or diabetes, regular checks can help manage these risks effectively.

Who needs a Heart Health Check?

- All people aged 45–79 years
- People with diabetes from 35 years
- First Nations people from 30 years

RSV Vaccines Now Available in NSW: Protecting Vulnerable Populations

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) is a leading cause of respiratory infections in infants, young children, and older adults, particularly those with underlying health conditions. In response to growing concerns over RSV outbreaks, New South Wales (NSW) has rolled out a range of vaccines aimed at protecting the most vulnerable members of the community. These vaccines are now available through your GP.

The newly approved RSV vaccines target key at-risk groups: infants under six months, older adults aged 75 and above, those at risk over 60, First Nations people over 60, and pregnant women. For older adults, particularly those with chronic respiratory or cardiovascular conditions, the *RSVpreF* vaccine offers a preventative measure to protect against serious illness and hospitalization. Pregnant women can also benefit from the vaccine, which is administered during the third trimester, at least 2 weeks before birth, with free access likely to roll out early in 2025. This vaccine helps transfer protective antibodies to the baby, providing the newborn with immunity against RSV during the first months of life when they are most vulnerable to severe illness. For infants, a new treatment, known as *nirsevimab*, is available in hospitals to reduce the severity of infections during peak RSV seasons.



NSW Health encourages everyone in the eligible groups to take advantage of these vaccines to reduce the burden of RSV on healthcare systems and protect the most vulnerable individuals. Health officials emphasize that vaccination, along with other preventive measures such as good hand hygiene and avoiding exposure during peak RSV periods, is key to limiting the impact of the virus. Reminders.... stay up to date with your vaccinations

Covid-19 Vaccine

It is especially important to get your 2024–2025 COVID-19 vaccine if you are ages 65 and older, are at high risk for severe COVID-19, or have never received a COVID-19 vaccine. New vaccine available mid-December 2024.

Shingles Vaccine

The shingles vaccine is administered in a two-dose course, and unlike the previously available shingles vaccine, is safe for immunocompromised people aged 18 years old and over.

If you are eligible and want to receive a COVID-19 and/or Shingles vaccination, call to book an appointment or visit the Terrigal or Avoca Beach Medical Centres.
